Europe Tour

Day 1: Flight to Bucharest

Today you will make your own way to the airport for your flight to Bucharest, Romania. The adventure begins!

Day 2: Bucharest

Upon arrival at Otopeni airport in Bucharest and after clearing Customs & Immigration, you will be met and transferred to your hotel in Bucharest.

The rest of the day remains at leisure.



Suggestion: You may walk around and explore Bucharest on your own.

Walk to the Parliament Palace, the second largest building in the world after the US Pentagon and the world's largest civilian administrative building.

Then you can head the Patriarchal Cathedral, Old Center of the City, Revolution Square, the Romanian Atheneum and the Victoriei Way.



Day 3: Bucharest (B)

Free day at leisure.



Day 4: Bucharest (B)

Small Group Tour to the Medieval Castles (12hours)

Today you will head to Sinaia, one of the most beautiful mountain resorts, the "Pearl of the Carpathians". You will visit the fabulous Peles Castle - former residence of the Royal family - with its armoury collection, unique for richness and its diversity. You will then visit Sinaia Monastery with its religious objects, icons, rare books and the exhibition of pottery and porcelain ware (dating from 16th - 19th centuries).

Then you will head to Bran Castle the so called "Dracula" castle that was built back in the 13th Century. Surrounded by an aura of mystery and legend and perched high atop a 200-foot cliff, Bran Castle owes its fame to its association with Prince Vlad the Impaler who inspired Bram Stoker's fictional Dracula.

Before heading back to Bucharest you will enjoy walking tour of Brasov downtown. Absorb how a typical Transylvanian old city looked like.

Day 5: Bucharest – Budapest (B)

Free day to explore the are on your own.



Suggestion: Visit the open-air ethnographic Village Museum that contains 272 authentic peasant farms and houses showcasing traditional Romanian village life.

Suggestion: Take a wine tour

In the evening you will be transferred to the train station for your overnight train to Budapest. (trains in Europe are great and they give a more playful sense to the journey. If you would prefer to fly to Budapest that is not a problem for me, just let me know and I will amend it accordingly)

Day 6: Budapest (B)

Upon arrival you will be transferred to your hotel.



The rest of the day remains at leisure.

Optional: Etyek Wine Country Tour with Dinner
Start your experience with a pickup at your centrally located Budapest hotel, and drive to the Etyek-Buda wine region, about 30 minutes away. Admire the vine-coated hills as you approach the town of Etyek, the hub of this relatively young wine industry that started when German settlers planted vines here around 200 years ago.

Hear about Etyek's famous fresh and crisp white wines, typically grown from pinot gris and sauvignon blanc grapes, and its celebrated sparkling Törley wine. Then, visit Old Wine Hill where nearly 1,000 mostly disused wine cellars sprinkle the slopes. Enjoy the views over the vineyards, public grape presses and villages below as your guide explains more about the local soils and acidities.

Visit small, family-run wineries and sample four wines in each, along with tasty Hungarian snacks. In the morning tour you will get to see two wineries and in the longer afternoon tour you will visit 3 wineries. As you sip, learn local winemaking secrets from your friendly host — usually the winery owner and winemaker rolled into one. Discuss each wine with the host and get a truly personal take on each variety you're tasting. You'll leave with a really intimate understanding of the traditions, peoples and countryside that make the wines here so special.

Afterward, enjoy a delicious 2-course dinner at a wine estate. If it's summer, dine outside, or if it's winter, sit down at a table inside a cellar. Savor the classic Hungarian dishes and discuss your wine discoveries as you eat, perhaps enjoying some wine (own expense) with your food. See the Itinerary for a sample menu.

Lastly, drive back to Budapest where a hotel drop-off marks the end of your tour.



Day 7: Budapest (B)

Free day at leisure.



Optional: Hip On Hip Off Bus & River Cruise

Explore the beautiful and historical city of Budapest, much of which is part of a UNESCO World Heritage Site, on a hop-on hop-off tour! Sightsee at your own pace aboard an open-top, double-decker bus, as well as a boat route on the Danube. You can hop on and off as many times as you like at any of the 28 stops to see Budapest's top attractions, including Heroes' Square, Margaret Island, Budapest Citadel and Hungarian State Opera House.

Start your hop-on hop-off tour through Budapest at Heroes' Square, Franz Liszt Square or any of the other 26 stops across all three routes. As the open-top, double-decker bus or boat transports you around town, hop on and off as many times as you like and wherever you like to see the best of Budapest at your own pace.

On the Red and Yellow lines, spend some time in the Buda Castle District, and then check off top city attractions like the Hungarian Parliament Building, the Hungarian State Opera House and UNESCO World Heritage-listed Andrassy Avenue. When you're ready for a little river action, head to one of the three stops on the Blue Boat Line to cruise down the Danube.



Day 8: Budapest (B)

Free day.

Optional: Small Group Budapest Caving Tour

Hungary's capital, Budapest, is famous for its hot springs. Many people visit Hungary's famous thermal baths, but only a few know that the hot water rushing up from deep underground created something else too. In the limestone mountains under Budapest, the heated water formed a huge cave system which is thought to be more than 100 km long. The spas and caves of Budapest are planned to be declared part of the UNESCO World Heritage. The longest cave of Budapest is the 20.1 km long Pál-völgyi-Mátyás-hegyi cave system located in the Duna-Ipoly National Park. It is a real multi-level labyrinth system with most of its chambers under the residential districts of Budapest.

If you aren't claustrophobic you can apply for our regularly scheduled cave tours which are guided by qualified caving guides. During the 2.5-3 hrs long tours you will often have to climb on walls and crawl through narrow passages so you have to be prepared for adventure.

The tours lead through natural parts of the cave, with the supervision of professional caving guides. All the necessary equipment - overall, helmet, light - is provided. You can change your clothes in changing rooms. Though one has to crawl, climb, scramble or creep many times during the tour, no previous experience in caving is needed.

Day 9: Budapest – Warsaw (B)

Free day till the evening!

In the evening you will be transferred to the train station for your overnight train to Warsaw.

Day 10: Warsaw (B,L)

Upon arrival you will be transferred to your hotel.

Small Group Historical Tour by Retro Nysa Van

This tour uses the old communist van "Nysa 522" as transportation during the trip to places that are usually not easy to find. The enthusiastic guides will lead the group to non-tourist areas, providing a unique experience for visitors of Warsaw.

On the way to the first stop, the tour visits the remains of the Communism at Constitution Square and Palace of Science and Culture. The tour continues to pre-war Warsaw streets which survived World War II, Jewish Ghetto and the bohemian Praga district.





The first itinerary stop on the tour is a visit to the city center where the streets that survived World War II are visible. Upon entrance, observe the gates, courtyards and staircases of yore. In many of those buildings, the bullet holes from the Warsaw Uprising are still intact, allowing for a complete immersive feel for the atmosphere of the Old Warsaw.

Stop in last street of the Jewish Ghetto to touch the part of Warsaw that doesn't exist anymore. This is a perfect place to talk about the cultural diversity that was so characteristic for Warsaw before the War. See the mix of different kinds of the architecture and afterwards, move to the communist world to exhibit the post-war ideas. See the way in which the communists rebuilt the city with a huge doze of propaganda. This stop includes a visit to the Constitution Square, Party House, and Palace of Culture and Science.

The next stop will be the bohemian Praga district. Praga survived the War, but it used to be a forgotten and dangerous part of the city. Recently, however, artists have moved here and they have transformed this district. Your guide will provide a good feel for the atmosphere of the local streets, old market, former vodka factory.

After seeing many attractions it's time for lunch in a milk bar, which used to be popular in the Communist times, to try typical Polish cuisine. After that the tour moves onto exploration of a different face of Praga: the old factory that recently was converted into the center of various activities.

The tour concludes with a visit to the Museum of Life under Communism. View a small apartment furnished in socialist style, a communist party member's office, a shop, a bar and a street from the era. See how people used to live and watch propaganda movies of the 1950s. We also kindly invite you for a typical aperitif before dropping guests off at their hotel.

Day 11: Warsaw (B,L)

Small Group Tour to Auschwitz

Auschwitz-Birkenau has become a primary symbol of the Holocaust. It was a network of concentration and extermination camps built and operated by the Third Reich in Polish areas annexed by Nazi Germany during World War II. The collection of the museum contains original documents, suitcases, shoes and other belongings of murdered prisoners. There you will find original fences, wooden watchtowers and railway ramps have been preserved.

The tour also includes a short ride to Birkenau camp, which functioned as a war camp, extermination camp and place from people were sent to labour in Nazi Germany. More than 90 per cent of prisoners, mostly European Jews, were killed there.



Day 12: Warsaw (B)

Free day at leisure.

Optional: Small Group Food Tour

*You will be picked up at around 12.00 noon from your hotel by our driver/guide in a Communist-era minivan. Travel in this unique vehicle and experience more of the city's highlights. Your first stop will be at a little pastry shop located in an old tenement house, where you will be served a traditional Polish doughnut, called *pańczyk* and pronounced *pouncek*. Then, your guide will take you to the local farmers' market to taste some of Polish delicacies including Polish sausage, pickled cucumbers with cabbage, smoked fish, delicious Polish bread and a traditional soft drink.*

*Experience life like a local as you visit each of these local favorites. Stop at a neighborhood eatery to try some hearty Polish soups including traditional *żurek* [zhurek]. This soup is made from a time-honored Polish recipe. A must-have are Polish dumplings and on this tour you get to try both *pierogies* and *pyzy*. Enjoy these delicious dumplings where they do it best, the Praga district just across the Vistula River. You will visit two of the best brasseries known for their *pierogies* and *pyzy*. Then, it is time to discover the secrets of locally made vodka and raise your glass to sample a shot. Return to your Warsaw accommodations at the end of this tour.*

Day 13: Warsaw – Berlin (B)

Today in the morning you will check out of your hotel and be transferred to the train station for your trip to Berlin.

Upon arrival you will be met and transferred to your accommodation.

The rest of the day is free at leisure.

Optional: Palace Tour, Dinner & Concert by the Berlin Residence Orchestra.

Charlottenburg Palace is today's largest residence of the royal house of Hohenzollern in Germany's capital Berlin. The sumptuous building is surrounded by unique baroque gardens featuring various architectural styles. The palace includes magnificently furnished chambers and ceremonial rooms with exclusive art collections.

You will begin the evening with a self-guided palace tour followed by a three course candlelight dinner in a cozy ambiance located at the Charlottenburg Palace Orangery. The beautiful performance by the Berlin Residence Orchestra will complete your evening.

The concert offers four (4) ticket categories. Categories VIP, A, B and C refer to the front, middle and rear part of the auditorium respectively. VIP guests enjoy preferred seating at the concert and will be served a glass of Champagne during the intermission.



Day 14 & 15: Berlin (B)

Free days.

Optional Hip On Hip Off Tour

Berlin hop-on hop-off tour allows you to hop-on and off as many times as you like aboard open top double decker buses. There are 18 stops around Berlin, and buses depart every 10 minutes during every season. The continuous route without hopping-off is approx. 2.5 hours and a guided commentary in 19 languages is available. Tickets are valid for 2 day from first use. Many must-see Berlin attractions are easily accessible enroute including Checkpoint Charlie, Berliner Dom (Cathedral), Pergamon Museum, Brandenburg Gate and the enchanting Charlottenburg Palace.

This 2 day, hop-on hop-off bus tour is a great introduction to the city, allowing you to explore the top sights at your own flexible pace.

Optional Upgrade to Berlin River Boat Tour Add a one hour boat trip to your Berlin hop-on hop-off tour and see the city from another vantage point. The tremendous views of the urban landscape unfold as you cruise along the River Spree. Simply hop-off the tour at Berliner Dom (Berlin Cathedral) and hop-on the boat tour. Departure between 10:00am and 3:00pm every 30 minutes, on Friday and Saturday until 4:00pm. After the cruise, you can continue to use the hop-on hop-off tickets to explore Berlin.

Day 16: Berlin – Munich (B)

Optional: Small Group Sachsenhausen Concentration Camp Memorial Walking Tour

While the Nazis were hosting the 1936 Olympic games, slave laborers were being forced to build a huge concentration camp just north of Berlin, intended to hold political 'enemies' of the Nazi regime political, racial and 'asocial'. Of the 200,000 people interned, more than 50,000 lost their lives before the camp was liberated by the Soviets in 1945.

The camp was then used by the Soviets until 1950 to detain former Nazis, German soldiers and political opponents of the communists. Many thousands more died from malnutrition and disease.

The key to this walking tour is the informative and illuminating narrative provided by your expert tour guide. During your 3-hour visit to the camp, you'll learn important background history of the site as you walk through the Appellplatz parade ground, the Jewish Barrack, punishment cells, execution grounds and crematorium, Station Z, the Pathology Laboratory and camp hospital.

This tour was researched by historian Gabriel Fawcett, who is publishing an important witness account of the camp. All tour guides have their own special insights into the history of Sachsenhausen, and are experienced in unraveling the complex history of the Third Reich and the Holocaust.

In the afternoon you will be transferred to the train station for your train to Munich. Enjoy the trip....

Upon your arrival late in the evening you will be met and transferred to your hotel.


Day 17: Munich (B)

Free Day.

Optional: Small Group Munich Bicycle Tour (4 hours) – entrance fees are not included

The bike paths are the secret passageways to Munich's heartlands. Your knowledgeable guide knows the best routes, interesting anecdotes and spots to stop for a quick beer. Visit the great royal centers of Königsplatz, Odeonsplatz and the Hofgarten. Continue to the magnificent Englischer Garten - one of Europe's largest city park, the famous Chinese Tower beer garden where you can stop for a snack (cost not included). Ride past the lovely banks of the River Isar and explore Munich's beautiful Old Town.





Day 18: Munich (B)

Neuschwanstein Castle Small Group Day Tour 9:30am, 10.5hrs

You'll be picked up from central Munich in the morning for your day trip to two gems of the Bavarian Alps: Neuschwanstein Castle and Linderhof Palace. On your scenic 1.5-hour drive, your expert guide provides commentary about the history and significance of the Bavaria region and its attractions.

Your luxury coach offers comfortable seats, panoramic windows, Wi-Fi and a restroom, ensuring optimal comfort throughout your journey. Enjoy a complimentary snack box

on board, with additional snacks and drinks available for purchase.

Your first stop is Linderhof Palace, a small palace built by King Ludwig II of Bavaria. Though inspired by France's Versailles Palace, Linderhof's interior is actually rather private and humble, as you'll see on your 1-hour guided tour, but head to the surrounding gardens and you'll discover why they're considered among the most beautiful in the world, combining elements of Baroque, Italian Renaissance and English styles.

Leaving Linderhof behind, head next to Oberammergau, where you'll have about 30 minutes of free time to walk around. Wander the lanes of this quaint village and see beautiful examples of the traditional art of woodcarving. Continue driving along famous Romantic Road to the foot of majestic Neuschwanstein Castle.



Before hiking up the hill for your guided tour of the castle, you can either have lunch (own expense) or set out for Mary's Bridge (Marienbrücke), the best spot for postcard views of the castle. The most famous of three royal palaces built for King Louis II of Bavaria, Neuschwanstein sits on a rugged hill above the village of Hohenschwangau.





Take a guided tour of the 19th-century Romanesque Revival palace to learn about its peculiar past: it was intended as a personal refuge for the reclusive, crazed king, but it was opened to the public after his death in 1886. Today Neuschwanstein is an architectural icon; in fact, it inspired Disney's Sleeping Beauty and closely resembles Sleeping Beauty Castle at Disneyland! After your tour of the castle, relax on the drive back to Munich.

Day 19: Munich (B)

Free day.

Optional: Dachau Concentration Camp Memorial Small Group Tour, 5hrs (depart 12:15pm)

Venture out of Munich by local transport for a comprehensive small group tour through Dachau Concentration Camp and memorial site. An authorized guide will share important information concerning the desperate survivors who'd been tortured and exploited throughout the course of World War II. Today, Dachau Memorial Site is a place of memory, of pilgrimage and of education and makes for an illuminating day trip from Munich.

Just outside the medieval town center of Dachau, a Memorial Site stands on the grounds of the former concentration camp. This was the 'parent' camp. Dachau was the 'Academy of Terror', the originator, role-model and training ground for the vast order of brutality that spread over half of Europe in the wake of the armies of the Third Reich, and which ultimately culminated in history's greatest crime, the Final Solution.

While each camp was responsible for its own particular form of barbarism, what distinguished Dachau is that almost everything that happened in the system as a whole happened at some level there. Almost every category of victim passed through its infamous Arbeit macht frei (Freedom through Work) gate, German dissidents, outspoken clergymen, Jehovah's Witnesses, homosexuals, Jews, Polish civilians, all in all the citizens of some 34 nations. Today's Memorial Site combines the historical authenticity of the original environment and its many surviving buildings with the function of a modern exhibition center. It is a place of memory, of pilgrimage and of education.

Day 20: Munich – Paris (B)

Early in the morning you will be transferred to the train station for your train to Paris.

Upon arrival you will be met and transferred to your hotel.

Seine River Cruise Dinner:

Enjoy a delicious 3-course meal on board the Marina de Paris restaurant boat whilst gliding down the Seine River. During your cruise you will see the most famous sites of Paris illuminated. Don't miss Notre Dame, the Louvre, Eiffel Tower and the stunning romantic bridges of Paris!



After dinner you will take a 1-hour visit to the Eiffel Tower's 2nd floor to enjoy stunning views across the whole city.

Moulin Rouge Paris

Next, head to the heart of Paris' nightlife, Montmartre, and the Moulin Rouge! You'll experience the Moulin Rouge's new "Féerie" review and the essence of Parisian cabaret. A troupe of 100 artists, including 60 legendary Doriss dancers, will entertain you dressed in exotic costumes of feathers, rhinestones and sequins. The sumptuous sets and vibrant light show of "Féerie" provide a colorful backdrop for brilliantly choreographed performances on moving staircases, in a gigantic aquarium, on swings and in garden settings.

Day 21 & 22: Paris (B)

Free days.

On one of those days you will have pre booked tickets for [Louvre Museum](#).

Optional: Hop on Hop off

See Paris at your own pace on a two-day hop-on hop-off tour. With four interconnected routes, this tour is the easiest way to get around Paris and see all the sights. Get a bird's eye view of the cobbled streets of the Left Bank, the Napoleonic splendor of the Ecole Militaire and the structure they thought wouldn't last more than a few years - the Eiffel Tower! Paris Grand Tour

The entire route takes 2 hours. Buses depart every 10 to 30 minutes from each stop. Highlights include Madeleine, Opera, Louvre Museum (we will prebook tickets so to skip the lines), Notre-Dame Cathedral, Saint-Germain-des-Pres, Orsay Museum, Concorde, Champs-Elysees, Arc de Triomphe, Trocadero, Eiffel Tower and Invalides.



Bastille-Bercy

The entire route takes 60 minutes. Buses depart every 30 minutes from each stop. Highlights include Notre-Dame Cathedral, Saint-Paul, Bastille, Gare de Lyon, Gare d'Austerlitz and Parc de Bercy.

Montmartre - Grands Boulevards

The entire route takes 60 minutes. Buses depart every 15 to 20 minutes from each stop. Highlights include Funiculaire de Montmartre, Gare du Nord, Gare de l'Est and Grands Boulevards.

Montparnasse - Saint-Germain

The entire route takes 60 minutes. Buses depart every 15 to 20 minutes from each stop. Highlights include Jardin du Luxembourg, Observatoire, Catacombes, Invalides and Saint-Germain-des-Pres.

Day 23: Paris (B)

Free Day.

*Optional: Versailles & Giverny Day tour Or
Half Day Food Tasting Tour Duration 3hours approx.*

Enjoy on a three-hour French gastronomy tour in the stunning Montmartre district. Sample food and wine during a professional tour of the city with an experienced guide. Take in the culture and cuisine while exploring eateries and shops through the eyes of a Parisian.

Your local Parisian guide will take you to a patisserie to enjoy some traditional French delicacies before a visit to a "fromage" shop to sample some favorite cheeses. Your personal guide will then lead your party to a classic chocolaterie where you will have the chance to eat mouthwatering chocolates. Your tour will include a stop at a boulangerie where you can sample classic French breads and baguettes and learn why you should never eat a baguette the wrong way around.

You will also drop into a creperie for a delicious crepe or galette. Your tour even includes a visit to a butcher shop, complete with a tasting of succulent French hams and cured sausages. Finally, your guide will pick out the perfect wine chosen to match your food and taste to enhance the entire experience. You will also enjoy a delicious secret dish along the way.

Montmartre is the perfect district for Paris food tours because of the area's flourishing restaurant scene, historical culture and charming ambiance. In the past, windmills, farming areas and art studios were prominent features of the Montmartre landscape. Now the area boasts an abundance of first-class wine bars, fine dining restaurants and rare shops, all adding to its appeal as one of the best and most unique food destinations in the world.

Today you will be transferred to the train station and take the chunnel to London.

Upon arrival you will be transferred to your accommodation.

Free days.

On one of the days you will have pre booked tickets for The [Tower of London](#).

On one of the days you will have pre booked tickets for [Westminster Abbey](#).

Optional: Hop On Hop Off Bus

You will have a free time to explore on your own with the Hop On Hop Off Bus (this bus takes you to all the major attractions around the city and has commentary on the bus. There is a frequent schedule so you can get off when you want to and pick up a bus when you are ready to move onto the next location.
